

It is my pleasure to present Ahlia University Annual Report for the academic year 2017/2018. Ahlia's five year strategic plan (2016 to 2020) is progressing well and we are achieving our set objectives and KPIs with full confidence. Our core activities of teaching, research and community engagement has gone from strength to strength. Ninety seven Ahlia academics have been listed on Scopus. Ahlia faculty have published 550 research papers and books with their publications being cited by other international researchers - 9073 citations.

The Ahlia faculty professional development plan, research plan and community engagement plan have played a major role in placing Ahlia as a leading university in Bahrain and the region. Our drive to achieve teaching excellence, research excellence, best graduate attributes as well as student and faculty community engagement have placed Ahlia in the international rankings. In 2017, the QS ranked Ahlia in the top 3% of over 1000 universities in Arab countries. Ahlia was ranked by QS in position 35 out of over 1000 universities. Furthermore, QS categorised Ahlia as the fastest rising university in the Arab region.

In 2017, Ahlia students have captured a number of awards and prizes. Ahlia football futsal team received HH Shaikh Nasser Bin Hamad Universities League cup. Ahlia basketball team received the first prize in the Universities Basketball League for Men and was awarded by HH Shaikh Isa Bin Ali Bin Khalifa Al Khalifa. Ahlia Students received the best product prize in Injaz Competition for Young Entrepreneurs.

In 2017, a number of Ahlia programmes have been placed on the Bahraini Education and Training Quality Authority (BQA) National Qualification Framework NQF. The college of Business and Finance is steaming ahead with its AACSB accreditation of its programmes. The College of Engineering and the College of Information Technology are both progressing with the ABET accreditation for their programmes. Many of Ahlia degree programmes have been reviewed and updated in 2017 in line with benchmarking findings and developments in the corresponding disciplines worldwide.

In2017, Ahlia faculty participated innumerous international research conferences. Ahlia held a number of research forums, activities and workshops, e.g., QS MAPLE Conference, Ahlia 5th Annual research forum, Ahlia- Brunel PhD annual symposium and the First Equal Opportunities Symposium.

At Ahlia, we believe in getting feedback from all stakeholder. Consequently, Ahlia conducts a total of 27 surveys from students, alumni, advisory boards, employers, etc. All such feedback has been fully utilised to improve Ahlia's services, enhance academic programmes, improve community engagements, etc.

The Directorate of International Relations In the 2017-18 Academic Year, the Directorate brought significant growth to the number of students engaged in international mobility. Numerous students visited Ahlia from institutions abroad and several domestic students were given the opportunity to attend various international study programmes in the UK and France.

The Directorate also ensured that all students were carefully assisted and provided with logistical and administrative support when needed. Overall, the Directorate hopes to follow up on this substantial growth in numbers and is actively working towards expanding its international mobility offerings to students in the coming years.

- Incoming The Directorate welcomed 23 students from the University's partner institution EPITECH, as a part of Ahlia's international exchange programme.

Thismarks anotable increase from the previous year's total of 21 students. Additionally, 3 Fulbright Fellows were welcomed to the University as English Teaching Assistants and Visiting Scholars; an increase from the previous year's total of 2 Fulbright Fellows.

The Directorate also coordinated with Bradford University in the UK to receive 5 Bradford University students as part of an international study tour covering the topics of Islamic Finance and Entrepreneurship in the GCC region. - **Outgoing** The 2017-18 Academic Year also brought an unprecedented increase to the number of outgoing students. 2 students spent the First Semester of the Academic Year at Brunel University London as a part of Ahlia's Study Abroad programme.

2018 also marked the first year of Ahlia's participation in Brunel's "Games Design Summer School, which 2 Ahlia students attended. Finally, 2018 saw the return of the highly successful "International Summer School" at Bradford University, which 3 students attended, and the "French Language Summer School", which 2 students attended at the France Langue institute in Paris, France.



Research & Scholarship

Ahlia University (AU) second basic pillar is Research. The distinctive research publications which were achieved by AU faculty on worldwide recognizable databases such as Scopus are a natural consequence of the comprehensive research support program that Ahlia University has recently established and included in the AU Research Plan 2016-2020. To this extent, AU won the third place among more than 19 universities in Bahrain and the first among the private universities in regard of the research publication

Ahlia's Research Plan:

AU's Research Plan 2016-2020 is derived from several strategic documents such as AU Strategic Plan 2016-2020, Bahrain National Strategy for Research and Bahrain's Economic Vision 2030.

Ahlia's Research Plan underpinning AU's vision to contribute to Bahraini and Gulf community development. Also, to work with faculty members, students and external partners in both industry and community to support world-class research and enterprise and to develop a sustainable portfolio of activities that strengthen and underpin the University's research base.

To this extent, AU formed four Niche areas which are Entrepreneurship, Islamic Banking and Finance, Information and as well as a community-based research project and AU faculty started to publish in those areas.

Ahlia's Sixth Annual Research Forum

Ahlia annual research forum which was held 22-23 April 2018 is a platform for Ahlia faculty, international academic and industrial experts to present their research. This provides a rich environment of scientific discussion through oral and poster presentations along with book exhibitions.

The Sixth Annual Research Forum included 4 keynote speakers from different disciplines and 2 keynote speakers were from outside AU as for Brunel University London and Bahrain Specialist hospital. In addition to more than 30 oral and poster presentation and book exhibition. This year forum was a good practice for PhD students to summarize their PhD story in three minutes.

The College of Graduate Studies and Research produces an abstract book of the research forum in addition to the slides presentation on AU website for more dissemination of those scientific output.

PhD Symposium 2017/2018

The annual PhD WR Symposium was held on 11th and 12th February 2018. 7 research papers were presented in the symposium in different categories (1. Entrepreneurship 2. Business & Organization 3. Health & Safety). The event was attended by Mr Simon Martin, British Ambassador to the Kingdom of Bahrain and Professor Thomas Betteridge, Vice Provost and Dean of College of Business, Arts and Social Science at Brunel University London.

The keynote was presented by Professor Ashely Braganza from Brunel University London. Prizes for the best 2 papers were awarded to Hala Hatoum and Nada Alyouha, respectively. Hasan Ghura and Amina Bullay were awarded the prizes for the best 2 presentations, respectively. Moreover, 4 research papers have been submitted and accepted for presentation at Gulf University for Science and Technology (GUST) in Kuwait as part of the 17th IFIP Conference (Doctoral Colloquium) on E-Business, E-Service and E-Society. The conference was held on 30th October 2018. This is part of an effort to convert all symposium papers to conference and journal publications co-authored by both Ahlia and Brunel supervisors

The symposium serves the purpose of encouraging the research activities within college of IT and Ahlia University. The symposium was a great opportunity to have guest speakers form industry and academic expert from Brunel University London, UK.

Ahlia University Centres

AHLIA CENTRE FOR ENTREPRENEURSHIP (ACE)

Ahlia Centre for Entrepreneurship (ACE) was established in February 2017, as an initiative to support and promote entrepreneurship at Ahlia University (AU) and the Bahraini community at large. ACE is intended to play a strategic role in promoting the spirit of entrepreneurship in Bahrain and create a new breed of young entrepreneurs who aspire to have a positive and lasting impact on their society. Accordingly, ACE aims to support the creation of new companies that add substantial job and bring about extra values to the Bahraini economy. To achieve this goal, the Centre provides programs and activities which enhance the entrepreneurial learning at Ahlia University and expand the students' knowledge of business creation and opportunity recognition.

GOALS

- To raise awareness about the importance of entrepreneurship as a key towards achieving the Economic vision 2030 and a key pillar within the national strategy.
- To spread the entrepreneurial culture at the university by developing the students' skills, providing experiential learning opportunities, conducting meaningful entrepreneurial research, and connecting students with mentors and resources.
- To educate, coach and encourage young entrepreneurs and freelancers to pursue business opportunities and succeed in transforming them into viable start-ups
- To provide potential entrepreneurs with the necessary tools and experiences to creatively pursue new innovative opportunities in the start-up, social and corporate venture arenas.
- To link the students 'academic knowledge with the business world through training, workshops, consultation, incubation and research.
- To make of the Entrepreneurship Centre a highly visible hub which would hold all entrepreneurship activities related to Ahlia University.

AHLIA CENTRE FOR STATISTICAL ANALYSIS

To reach its goal of becoming a contributive research university, Ahlia University has created a Centre of Statistical Analysis (CSA) to give researchers' students and faculty training courses that would be used in their research work across all colleges and departments, including the PhD students, of the campus. The primary mission of the CSA will be to enhance social science, IT and Engineering research at AU by: 1) launching training courses to train young researchers in advanced and innovative statistical research methods, 2) Provide Faculty and research students with the proper statistical advice, 3) encouraging high-quality interdisciplinary research across departments and colleges. As a research supporting centre, the CSA would be a multidisciplinary centre that is primarily research data analysis in nature and will not be the home unit for research courses or primary appointments. This centre is directed by Dr. Said T. EL Hajjar.

Dr. EL Hajjar is an Associate Professor in Mathematics, Statistics and Education at Ahlia University in the Kingdom of Bahrain. Dr. EL Hajjar has taught different courses in mathematics and statistics for over 20 years. He has supervised many MBA and PhD students in different fields of education. Outside of the classroom, Said has participated in many scientific papers at different international conferences and workshops. He was a keynote speaker at the Gulf E-Commerce Forum GEF 6, 2013. He has published in referee journals several research papers supporting mathematics, statistics, management, interactive learning, e-learning education, e-business and marketing. He has published the mathematics book "Introductory Mathematical Analysis" for sophomore and Junior students at X-Libris Publishing House in USA ", and the two statistical books "Basic & Business Course in Statistics I" and "Basic & Business Course in Statistics II" for Sophomore, Junior and Senior students at Author Publishing House in UK . His book "Probabilities & Statistics" has been published in Germany

at "LAMBERT Academic Publishing". He recently published with his PhD student, Dr. Madina Taha, the book entitled: Investigating the Success of E-Learning in Secondary Schools: The case of the Kingdom of Bahrain at SARA BOOK PUBLICATION, India in 2016.

Dr. EL Hajjar has been awarded the OUTSTANDING SCIENTIST AWARD (in the category of Science / Statistics) of the Research Awards - VIFRA 2015 issued by Venus International Foundation. EL Hajjar has been awarded the Research World Excellent Paper for the category Best Presentation/Best Content at the Research World International Conference, Barcelona, Spain. October 2016.

is an invention fab for anyone interested in invention from the Ahlia University or outside. This Centre believes that the practice of innovation brings out skills within us to compete in a global environment, leading to a more prosperous society and world economy. The purpose of the Invention Centre is to further develop and support the community of entrepreneurial and innovative talent.

AHLIA HEALTHCARE RESEARCH CENTRE (AHCRC)

One research is conducted by Dr Sayed Tantawy and Dr Dalia Kamel to investigate obesity and blood pressure among Middle school's students in Bahrain. Furthermore, many publications were produced under same theme by Dr Anjum Razzaqi, Dr Tillal Eldabi and Ms Noor El Sayed.




Annual Report 2017/18: Reviews

The summer

College of Arts & Science



The College of Arts & Science demonstrates excellence and innovation in Mass Communications & Public Relations(MCPR) and Interior Design (INTD) programmes. It exemplifies Ahlia University's commitment to academic excellence as well as contributes to the Ahlia's status as a great global community research University in Bahrain with a view to solving real world problems by conducting research and providing relevant and substantial skills to its students. The college includes three service departments that serve all programmes at Ahlia University through mathematical, English, Arabic and foreign studies.

In 2017-2018 we updated the TV and Audio studios to support MCPR courses with the necessary tools and materials that prepare students to acquire the practical skills and knowledge required to make our graduates compete in the market. This update was done to fulfil the feedback raised be advisory board members and stakeholders. Art and Computer labs were also updated with specialist software and tools to enhance the Interior Design Department. Moreover, additional interior design studios and workshop classes were established and a printer was installed in a lab for students.

Co-curricular activities enhanced the programmes and provided perception to the area. In this academic year, we hosted more than twenty events and eight internal seminars. The events give our students opportunities to adopt analytical and communication skills as well as building awareness of organisational development and workplace ethics. Specific exposure to real world organisational functioning is also given through internship that last eight weeks and a senior graduation research project involving a field study.

The College carries on to be distinguished in world-class research. Our faculty published several books and articles in referee and indexed journals. A good number of our faculty participated in various international, regional and local conferences. Research is implemented in most of the courses and most of the research topics are related to industrial needs.



The College of Business and Finance continues offering high quality programmes that cater to industry requirements and offer a high level of employability. The College also continues to engage its students and faculty in many activities, internally and externally, as part of its commitments towards the community and the Ahlia University strategic plan. The College offers eight programmes in Business and Finance subjects: five Bachelors', an MBA, a Master's in Engineering Management (with George Washington University, USA) and a PhD (with Brunel University London, UK). All curricula are innovative and develop relevant knowledge and work-related skills; and, wherever possible, include professional certifications.



We collaborate with CIMA, ACCA and the Chartered Institute for Securities & Investment (CISI). Proposals for new partnerships and new programmes are under consideration to make the learning experience more robust and match it with industry requirements and international learning trends.

In 2017/18, the College conducted many sessions as part of the process for accreditation by AACSB, a well-known internationally-recognized business-specific accreditation. The College believes that such an international accreditation would add value to its programmes. Acquiring this accreditation is in turn a part of Ahlia University's strategic plan, specifically objective fifteen which says states that the Ahlia intends to "gain accreditation for the university and international accreditation for programmes."

We aim to develop socially responsible professionals that are capable of leading and contributing to the economic growth of Bahrain and the region, through programmes and co-curricular activities.

In 2017/18, were taken on numerous field trips to the offices of leading organisations in the industry, such as KPMG and Gulf Air Company, where our students have had the opportunity to see these companies in action and interact with staff.

Activities this year include, the "Together S.A.F.E" Campaign, AACSB awareness sessions, INJAZ Bahrain (students' competition), Embedding of Research into Teaching & Learning, Embedding of Entrepreneurship into Teaching & Learning, Ahlia Entrepreneurship Day: The Spring of Entrepreneurship, and Ethical Business Practices: Preparing Future Leaders for the Corporate Environment and many other events. As part of our research activities, faculty members attended several international academic conferences as presenters and/ or as conference chairs.

The College also continued publishing as well as impactful research this year, covering numerous areas such as accounting and finance; entrepreneurship; teaching and learning; corporate governance, intellectual capital; human capital; management and marketing; service quality; healthcare; higher education; banking; auditing; economics; e-learning; and E-business.

College of Engineering

The College of Engineering offers four-year Bachelor of Science degrees in Computer and Communication Engineering and Mobile and Network Engineering. The degrees are taught with a depth of theory as well as a hands-on approach to enable students to perform a broad panoply of technical tasks with high competence. Learning is further enhanced through cocurricular activities such as field visits to local and regional organisations and participation in engineering competitions. In 2017 the College integrated this learning approach by encouraging students to participate in Huawei's MEET ICT Competition. Two students were among the top ten students in Bahrain.

The College also participated in the National Charted Day by exhibiting one of the best student projects in the celebration. Furthermore, students are also encouraged to participate in international events and activities. In 2018 two students participated in Huawei's "Seeds for the Future" programme, which is a two week study trip to China.

One student also went to Brunel University, London as part of a Games Designing Summer Project; herrole was as a programmer. Additionally, as part of the students' co-curriculer activities, the College invited guest lecturers to enrich students' awareness about matters pertaining to the practice of engineering in Bahrain. A mentorship session was given to the female engineering students by the Supreme Council for Women in Bahrain to endorse women's role in engineering. Another awareness session was held by the Council for Regulation of Engineering Professions to inform students about the law of practicing engineering professions in Bahrain.

As part of the continuous development of programmes offered by the College and in line with the college's mission to ensure that students receive high quality and internationally recognised education, the College of Engineering applied for the placement of the BSMNE and BSCCE programmes on the Bahrain National Qualification.

Moreover, as an initial step to apply for ABET accreditation, the College modified the BSMNE and BSCCE study plans to meet ABET requirements. The new study plans were implemented in the Second Semester 2017-18 with content that is in full compliance with ABET Engineering curricula criteria.

Furthermore, the College of Engineering encourages all its faculty members to be participate in professional organisations and conduct research. All faculty hold an IEEE membership along with specific memberships in IEEE societies, such as the IEEE Communications Society, IEEE Signal Processing Society, IEEE System, Man, and Cybernetics Society, IEEE Computer Society and ACM Computer Society.

Others have memberships in the Institution of Engineering and Technology (IET). Throughout 2017-18, faculty members published several conference and journal papers covering numerous topics including Wavelet Based Signal Analysis and Classifications, SVM Classification, DOM Based Cross-Site Scripting and Wireless Sensor Networks. Furthermore, one of the College's faculty members was awarded the GCC Award for Pioneers in Engineering in February 2018.

Faculty are also actively involved in community service activities such as giving speeches/ lectures at forums and in events organised by professional societies. They also participated in judging competitions and were members of organising committees of various forums.



The IT College offers Bachelor's degrees in Information Technology and Multimedia Systems, and a Master's degree in Information Technology and Computer Science.

All of our programmes are designed to meet industry needs and produce high quality professionals who will excel in their careers and contribute to society. In 2017/18, we continued to enhance our programmes based on the feedback received from reviewers and stakeholder surveys.

The title of the Bachelor's Degree in Distributed Systems and Multimedia has been changed to Multimedia Systems.

Furthermore, all of our Bachelor's programmers have been validated by Bahrain's National Qualification Framework.

The College's programmes have a hands-on reality-based approach, so students can apply the things they learn to solve real-life problems, thus preparing them to become future innovators and leaders.



Academic courses are complemented with Oracle and Microsoft professional courses, and we prepare students for the globally-recognised International Computer Driving License (ICDL),certification.

The College collaborated with INJAZ Bahrain, as part of Junior Achievement Worldwide, which aims to empower young people, open their minds to their own potential and prepare them for today's business challenges.

In 2017/18, our IT students participated in the INJAZ Bahrain Competition, has and won the prize of the Best Product (a webbased system).

Furthermore, the IT College has been awared the Entrepreneurial Skills Pass (ESP) certification, an international qualification that certifies students to start a business or to become successfully employed through an online test.

We have nominated our IT College students to undertake this pilot assessment due to the commitment and dedication they exhibited during this year's company program.

The results of the assessment will determine INJAZ Bahrain's viability to implement the ESP certification across all company program participants for years to come.

The College of Information Technology organized a research symposium for MITCS students to present their research progress and prepared them for their upcoming evaluations.

The symposium in turn promoted further research activities within college of IT and Ahlia University, and a number of our faculty members were awarded for their research contributions.

College of Medical & Health Sciences



The College is committed to the cultivation of outstanding students who possess the adequate knowledge, satisfactory attitude and proficient skills to prepare them to become competent physiotherapists who are responsive to the well-being of people, both locally and internationally. In 2017/18, the College aims to upgrade the standards of health care practice in the region in the areas of clinical experience, education and research. Likewise, the College submitted program proposals for the opening of other allied health programmes.



In addition, the college collaborated with Brunel University to lay down the initial plan for the opening of a post-graduate degree.

Graduates of the Bachelor's Degree in Physiotherapy in 2017/18 demonstrated their global competitiveness with many acquiring post-graduate degrees in prestigious universities in the US & UK. A majority of them were involved in research as they applied clinical reasoning skills in diverse health settings, i.e. private practice, hospitals, rehabilitation and sporting facilities, community organizations, and industrial and schoolbased rehabilitation settings.

International seminars and various events were organized to develop research interests in the field. Many were attended by students, faculty, staff and physiotherapy professionals in the kingdom.

In 2017/18 our faculty conducted several local, regional and international scientific presentations with special citations on topics including physiotherapy managements for various neurological problems, vestibular rehabilitation and disability empowerment. Some of them published scientific papers in international journals on research topics such as the effects of headphone on postural stability, efficacy of lumbar mobilization on postpartum low back pain and academic institutions providing community-based rehabilitation programs.

Deanship of Graduate Studies & Research





The Deanship of Graduate Studies and Research (GSR) is keen to provide sustainable development for graduate students in different programs and research for faculty and staff.

In order to achieve this dynamic sustainable environment, a variety of vast activities and events have been held, such as workshops, guest lectures, developmental seminars, research forums, poster sessions and symposia.

The Deanship supports and encourages faculty to publish their academic work in international journals, attend reputable conferences, acquire project grants, and apply for awards, and more.

Graduate Students have access to faculty members with international experience in a wide variety of subjects. To this extent, Ahlia University offers Master and Doctoral degree programmes in different disciplines and additionally with international partnerships.

Administration


Ahlia's administrative directorates and units are key contributors to its success, through work which supports the programme offering. Brief reports on activities in 2016/17 are included below.

- Administrative Services continued to support the University across all of its operational functions, through the provision of effective facility maintenance, facility management, safety and security services.
- Centre for Accreditation and Quality Assurance updated and monitored the implementation
 of the quality management system (AUQMS) and conducted internal programme evaluations. The
 Department also assisted with NQF programme mapping; facilitated activities for HEC, AACSB
 and ABET accreditation; and supported all internal processes for BQA's Review of programmes
 and NQF placement.
- **Centre for Measurement and Evaluation** supported the functioning of all of the University's administrative and academic departments through the design, implementation and analysis of surveys and other evaluation exercises throughout the year.
- **Financial Affairs** continued to streamline the provision of financial services across all academic and administrative departments, by introducing various improvements to ensure efficient and faster processing times of transactions, regular timely reporting; reduced fee debts and compliance with new external regulations
- Human Resources continued to support all Ahlia academic and administrative staff through the provision of essential employee services in the area of employee relations. All activities were evaluated and improved upon throughout the year, to streamline user support and ensure compliance with regulations.
- Information & Communications Technology (ICTC) continued to maintain the University's
 robust ICT infrastructure and ensured that all staff and students were satisfied through the
 provision of a secure Wi-Fi enabled campus, stable network operations and software, as well
 as cloud-based services. Furthermore, the ICTC Department continued with the provision and
 maintenance of its knowledge-based services including e-learning technology, virtual labs, online
 library, and other knowledge
- Information Systems Support continued to develop, monitor, update and upgrade the functionalities of the Ahlia Student Management Information System [ADREG] and Ahlia Financial ERP system. It continued its support to junior management by providing functionalities to generate operational data for planning and control and help them in Decision-making. Furthermore, all systems were continuously reviewed to make sure the updated policies/ procedures are implemented and workshops were conducted.





- International Relations met with the representatives of several intuitions abroad for the consideration of potential future collaborations and partnerships. Additionally, the Directorate received 23 students from EPITECH and ensured that they were supported and provided with guidance and administrative assistance when needed. 3 Fulbright Fellows were also received, marking an increase from the previous academic year.
- **Library** continued supporting students and academic staff through the provision of text borrowing and reference services. Furthermore, open days, training sessions and workshops were held to increase awareness among students and staff of the University's Library services.
- Public Relations & Media continued to organize and coordinate PR activities throughout the year while ensuring that all corresponding collaterals were provided. More notably, the department assisted with the planning, coordination and the relaunch of the University's website which took place in 2018 and successfully bolstered the University's web-ranking.
- **Strategic Planning** worked and coordinated with other staff members in each College and Directorate throughout the University to ensure the implementation of the University's overall Strategic Plan. Additionally, enhancements to the Strategic Plan were considered through consultation with the appropriate staff members for potential implementation in the coming Academic Year.
- Media Production Resources: continued to provide the University with its creative graphic design, print and publication services, alongside video and photography coverage of various events, workshops, and visitations from foreign staff and other external stakeholders that took place throughout the year. Numerous events and workshops were covered including Ahlia's 13 th Graduation Ceremony, the 1st Equal Opportunity Conference, and the QS Maple 2018 Conference.





Deanship of Student Affairs

The Deanship of Student Affairs supports the University in all matters pertaining to students' registration, fees, record-keeping and graduation. Moreover, it handled numerous activities throughout the 2017/18 Academic Year.

- Admissions, Registration & Graduation: The three units of the Admission, Registration & Graduation Department continued supporting all Ahlia students and staff by managing all matters related to students' applications and their graduation from the University. The most high-profile activity this year was the 13th Graduation Ceremony which was held under the Patronage of His Royal Highness the Prime Minister and graduated over 300 students.
- **Professional Relations** liaised with over 140 organisations all over Bahrain and across numerous sectors and industries to assist students upon graduation. More specifically, students were supported through the provision of internships and the organization of Careers Day which involved the participation of over 50 organizations in Bahrain that were looking to hire Ahlia graduates.
- Counselling & Guidance worked throughout the year to help students resolve their personal concerns and also provided them with academic support services, mediation, emotional support during the transition to University life, and assistance in coping with a medical or psychiatric diagnosis, mentoring etc. The department coordinated with departments throughout the University to ensure that all matters of concern to students and/or conflicts between students were addressed in a timely fashion and were resolved effectively.
- Student Activities & Services supported students well-being through the organization of various activities throughout the year. These activities include sports activities and students' participation in athletics teams, cultural activities such as poetry competitions, MUN participation, Symposium on petroleum information and workshop in Bahrain Parliamentary Training Centre about Kingdom of Bahrain Elections, social (Dessert camp, charity, visiting elderly home and Iftaar Saem in Holy Ramadhan, health awareness (Think Pink Cancer Awareness, blood donation campaign, The directorate is also responsible for providing support and services to AU elected Student Council.

There are two active student's clubs as the Media Club & Theatre Club which are overseen by the Directorate of Student Activities and Services, these are the Toastmaster Club and the Music club. AU provide sport facilities to its students through an agreement with Barbar and Al Naser clubs so that students can use their sport and recreational facilities.

Student contributions and achievements are acknowledged and honored by the top management through various events and recognition programmes. AU organizes an annual ceremony to recognize the high GPA achievers who are listed in the President's and Dean's Honour lists.

During the 2017-2018, AU had organized a gala dinner at the Diplomat Hotel to honor its football team who won the gold medal of First Nasser Bin Hamad Tournament for Universities, its basketball team who won the gold medal of the university's basketball tournament, and the IT student team who won the Best Product Prize of INJAZ.
