Developed in collaboration with library and graduate school communities, the ProQuest Electronic Theses and Dissertation Dashboard (ETD Dashboard) is an insightful summary of data generated from the usage and retrieval of dissertations and theses from the ProQuest platform.

Institutions can use the ETD Dashboard to view their dissertation and theses retrieval trends by categorizations such as subject, author, country, and university.

Librarians and administrators can then use the data to inform a range of activities including:

- Benchmarking
- Investment decisions
- Grant proposal development
- Marketing strategies
